August Meeting

We met on August 13 for our Afternoon Tea Fund Raising Event. Barbara extended a warm welcome to our members, guests from other WI's, the general public and Matt Holland, our speaker

After everyone had a cup of tea, food and was nicely settled down, Barbara reminded us about the coffee morning, walk and working party at the Rampsonwillis, then introduced Matt Holland, press officer from North Dartmoor Search & Rescue (NDS&R). He spoke about how he got involved, how he always wanted to be part of this volunteer group.



It was sad to hear that there is a growing trend for members of the public who wished to end their days on Dartmoor and the poor volunteers have to search for them.

The team often walk many miles in the worst possible conditions, often taking much, much longer walking back with a casualty on a stretcher, but they will always follow up a call for help no matter the weather.

If you are in trouble, call 999 and ask for the police the Mountain Rescue. Matts advice:

Always tell someone where you are going, which route you plan to take and what time you plan to be back. If the person doesn't come back as planned, make that 999 call!

Matt kept his talk brief so as not to bore people, but everyone was fascinated and interested, so much so that Matt answered about 15 questions from the floor.

Matt was indeed very informative and helpful and enjoyed our WI welcome. We raised a fantastic sum of more than £500 for North Dartmoor Search & Rescue - well done all.

Another scam doing the rounds.....

It seems never-ending and we all need to be vigilant! The latest seems to be a 'Cost of Living' scam where people are contacted about a £900 cost of living payment.

The scammers will text you saying that "you have not yet claimed your £900 annual living allowance" and will include a link to a convincing, but fake, web page that promises a payout of £900 in return for your credit/debit card details.

The Top Giveaways to spot the scam:

- 1. The website address: gov-subsidy.top
- 2. Bad grammar and punctuation: ...notice to you. please submit
- 3. The urgency: valid for three days, act now

Be careful when you received unsolicited text messages from numbers you don't know. If in doubt, check a completely new gov.uk webpage or contact the <u>Citizens</u> <u>Advice Bureau</u> for help. To report a scam call <u>Action Fraud</u> 0300 123 2040

If you think you may have been scammed, contact your bank immediately and let them know. Don't be embarrassed, these scammers are professionals and it's easy to fall foul of them!

For a limited time those eligible can obtain a virtual voucher Funded by UK Government to encourage Openreach to upgrade our Lewdown Telephone Exchange to full fibre broadband via the Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme.

There is no cost to you, all that is required is to pledge to use the service if it becomes available. As of Sept 3rd 63 homes and 1 local business in our community have pledged £288,000 hitting 44.4% of the required target.
